



#### **Morning Routines**

All Year 4 children will be welcomed from 8.30 am each day at the classroom doors. They will unpack their bags and then find their seat. Each morning, the interactive whiteboard will outline the timetable for the day and also some Early Morning Work linked to their learning. This could be an English, Maths or Topic based activity. The children are expected to prepare themselves for the day by using the toilet before the register and also ensuring that their water bottle is filled up.

### English

In Term 3, we shall be reading an inspiring science fiction children's novel entitled 'The Iron Man', by Ted Hughes. This story is both thought provoking and suspenseful. It tracks the experiences of a young boy and the Iron Man, who will eventually save the world from a monstrous creature! Over the coming Term, some of the writing we shall be producing, inspired by the text, will include character descriptions, poems, prequels and interviews. We shall continue to learn and revise key SPAG concepts, like the use of apostrophes for plural possession and how to develop a paragraph, and will also keep practising our dictionary and thesaurus skills too. As always, we will be using Drama and Art in the classroom to develop and support our writing further.

# Maths

We teach Maths daily and all sessions begin with an arithmetic starter and are followed by a main session of learning. This term we will be focusing on the following areas: Number, Four Operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division), Fractions, Decimals, Position and Direction. There will also be a focus on times tables, especially as children in Year 4 are expected to know all of their times tables (up to 12x) by the end of the year. Most areas of Maths depend on good times tables knowledge; please rehearse them with your children as much as possible at home.

### Home Learning and Blogs.

Two 'Love to Learn' tasks will be sent home each term. These will be explained to the children and info will be uploaded onto the blog too. Weekly spelling will be sent weekly via the blog as well. Times tables should be practised at home and children are tested every Friday. Blog posts will keep you up to date with our classroom learning.

# RAPS Curriculum

In Term 3, Team Amin shall be focusing on history and exploring the Stone Age up to the Iron Age in "Stone to Iron". We shall be working on developing chronological understanding and encouraging the children to compare life through the ages to life as it is now. Some of the work we will be producing this term includes pieces of art, detailed timelines, information texts and adverts.

### **Arts Curriculum**

Through our Arts curriculum the children will focus on Music, Dance, Drama and Art. These subjects will be taught across the week in the afternoons.

# Reading

It is our expectation that children read for at least 10 minutes each night. They might do this through Bug Club, a banded book or a free choice book. All teacher communication is through the child's reading record which should be in every day but especially on a Monday. Reading should be logged 3x a week in the record. Children are also heard reading throughout the week in class with an adult.

#### PE

We will have PE on Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons. Please ensure all children have a full kit in school. Swimming will take place on Thursdays so we will need suitable swimwear.

#### General

Sipping water throughout the day aids concentration and learning. Please provide your child with a water bottle which they may keep with them throughout the day. It is vital that pupils arrive at school on time and that absence is kept to a minimum. Frequent lateness and absences can have a huge negative impact on a child's learning so please try to have your child in school by 8.30 am every day.

# Uniform

Our school uniform exists both for health and safety reasons and to develop a sense of pride and responsibility in being a member of the RAPS community. The uniform policy includes the expectation that all children will wear black school shoes (trainers are not acceptable footwear), that long hair should be tied back at all times and that with the exception of a watch and a pair of small stud earrings NO jewellery may be worn by children. We also ask you to remember that children should not be wearing make-up or nail varnish to school and hair styles should not be extreme - this includes unnatural hair colours. The school's uniform policy is listed online. Please ensure your child is dressed according to this policy and that all items of clothing are clearly named.
