Year 3 Curriculum



Morning Routines

All Year 3children will be welcomed from 8.15 am each day at the classroom door. They will unpack their bags and then find their seat. Each morning, the interactive whiteboard will outline the timetable for the day and also some Early Morning Work linked to their learning. This could be an English, Maths or Topic based activity. The children are expected to prepare themselves for the day by using the toilet before the register and also ensuring their water bottle is filled up and in the tray.

English

In Term 3, we will be reading, writing and performing poetry. We will be reading and discussing a range of poems – from nonsense poems such as the Ning, Nang Nong to raps such as those written by Michael Rosen. Whilst looking at published poetry, we aim to explore techniques such as the use of similes and metaphors as well as understanding rhyming and syllables to help the flow and rhythm. Utilising these skills, as well as the structure of poems such as Kit Wright's 'The Magic Box', the children will write their very own poetry. The final step is to focus on the performance element, considering pace, pitch, volume, expression and intonation.

Maths

We teach Maths daily and all sessions begin with an arithmetic starter which is followed by a main session of learning. This term we will be focussing on the following areas: understanding place value, including estimating and identifying numbers – such as on a blank numberline; developing and consolidating written methods for the four main operations, statistics (being able to read information from tables and charts) and measures. Most areas of Maths depend on good times table knowledge; please rehearse them as much as possible at home.

Home Learning and Blogs.

Two 'Love to Learn' tasks will be sent home this term, our first task will be asking the children to build on last term's core text – Charlotte's Web.

Fortnightly spelling and tables will also be sent via regular blogs. These blogs posts will also keep you up to date with the learning in our classroom.

RAPS Curriculum

This term, we will be beginning a topic entitled 'Blasts from the Past!'. Within this unit of learning, we explore the Ancient Egyptians. This will include looking at their way of life, the importance of the river Nile, the construction of the pyramids and hieroglyphics. After the Egyptians there will be a few sessions on the Romans as well. Keep checking our blog to see our topic learning

Arts Curriculum

Through our Arts curriculum the children will focus on Music (Tuesday), dance (Thursday), drama (Tuesday) and Art (Wednesday). There is also an options session on a Thursday.

Reading

It is our expectation at Ramsgate Arts primary School that children read for at least 10 minutes every night. If they wish, the children may complete the 'book review' section of their reading record at the end of each book. Please also ensure that your child has their reading record at school every day so that they are able to read with a teacher or TA if asked.

PE

Year 3will have PE every Monday and
Thursday afternoon. Please ensure that they
have a full kit in school. They also need it for
dance so please leave it Monday to Friday.

General

Sipping water throughout the day aids concentration and learning. Please provide your child with a water bottle which they may keep in the tray by the sink. It is vital that pupils arrive at school on time and that absence is kept to a minimum. Frequent lateness and absences can have a huge negative impact on a child's learning so please try to have your child in school by 8.30 am every day.

Uniform

Our school uniform exists both for health and safety reasons and to develop a sense of pride and responsibility in being a member of the RAPS community. The uniform policy includes the expectation that all children will wear black school shoes (trainers are not acceptable footwear), that long hair should be tied back at all times and that with the exception of a watch and a pair of small stud earrings NO jewellery may be worn by children. We also ask you to remember that children should not be wearing make-up or nail varnish to school and hair styles should not be extreme - this includes unnatural hair colours. The school's uniform policy is listed online. Please ensure your child is dressed according to this policy and that all items of clothing are clearly named.
