

Ramsgate Arts Primary School -Year R Curriculum



Morning Routines All Year R children will be welcomed from 8. 15 am each day at the classroom doors. They will unpack their bags, hang up their coat, put their book in the basket and put their water bottle in class. Please encourage them to do this independently and say goodbye to them at the cloakroom. If you have any questions, please feel free to speak to the teacher at the door. Each morning, there will be a range of fine motor, maths and literacy activities on the tables that the children can choose from. During this time they will change their reading books and register with the class teacher.

Read, Write, Inc.

In Term 4 we will be changing groups for RWI and introducing them to a number of new sounds, including special friends. We will be encouraging them to try hearing the sounds in words and we will be learning to write sentences. This quickly progresses onto using capital letters and full stops. We will begin to learn some 'red words' and will be introduced to new 'green words' linked to our sounds. Please complete your child's sounds book with them weekly (new sounds will be added every Friday) and also encourage them to think of as many words that begin with that sound. Please ask us for another sounds sheet for the handwriting patters if you no longer have it.

Maths

We teach Maths daily and all sessions begin with a warm up quick fore starter and follows by a main session of circle time learning. This term we will be focussing on the follow areas: addition, subtraction, reading and interpreting calculations, halving, sharing, odd and even, capacity, sequencing events, counting in 2s, 5s and 1os using and start to use everyday language related to time. Most areas of Maths depend on a solid understanding of number. Please practice counting everything and pointing out numbers to 20 with your child.

Home Learning and Blogs.

Our 'Love to Learn' tasks will be sent home this term will be to grow your own plant, ready for our next topic 'Growth'. Please take photos and stick it into the book of the process. Please can there be some writing, drawings and labels too. Please let this be your child's ideas and work but please feel free to help them to present this. RAPS Curriculum This term, we will be beginning a topic entitled 'Superheroes'. Within this unit of learning we explore heroes in our local area, who are heroes to us and why? What superhero would you be? What would your powers be? We will also be studying the text 'Supertato' and the adventures he has against the evil pea.

Our Superhero dress up day will be on Wednesday 11th March. We will also have a peer massage morning on Thursday 26th March from 8-15-9am and an Easter Craft workshop on Monday 30th March at 1:30pm.

Arts

Through our Arts curriculum the children will focus on Music and Art. These subjects will be taught on a Tuesday afternoon. **Reading** It is our expectation at Ramsgate Arts primary School that children read for at least 10 minutes every night. Please continue to read one of our book corner books to your child and change this daily. When your child is orally blending CVC words and can identify most set 1 sounds, this will be when the phonics books will go home. Please keep an eye out and continue to practise oral blending at any opportunity. When you child has a phonics book. Please ensure you read daily and sign your child's reading record when you have finished reading. Please also ensure that your child has their reading record in school every day so that they are able to read with a teacher.

PE This term we will be doing dance in the studio every Friday. Please ensure that your child has their indoor P.E. kit in school (tshirt, shorts and plimsoles). We will be exploring balance, body parts and travelling.

General Sipping water throughout the day aids concentration and learning. Please provide your child with a water bottle which they may keep with them throughout the day. It is vital that pupils arrive at school on time and that absence is kept to a minimum. Frequent lateness and absences can have a huge negative impact on a child's learning so please try to have your child in school by 8.30 am every day. Please also bring in wellies for outside learning.

Uniform Our school uniform exists both for health and safety reasons and to develop a sense of pride and responsibility in being a member of the RAPS community. The uniform policy includes the expectation that all children will wear black school shoes (trainers are not acceptable footwear), that long hair should be tied back at all times and that with the exception of a watch and a pair of small stud earrings NO jewellery may be worn by children. We also ask you to remember that children should not be wearing make-up or nail varnish to school and hair styles should not be extreme - this includes unnatural hair colours and NO JoJo style bows. The school's uniform policy is listed online. Please ensure your child is dressed according to this policy and that all items of clothing are clearly named.
