Year 5 Curriculum Term 2



Morning Routines

All Year 5 children will be welcomed from 8.15 am each day at the classroom doors. They will unpack their bags and then find their seat. Each morning, the interactive whiteboard will outline the timetable for the day and also some Early Morning Work linked to their learning. This could be an English, Maths or Topic based activity. The children are expected to prepare themselves for the day by using the toilet before the register and also ensuring their water bottle is filled up.

English

This term, we will be reading the book 'Who Let the Gods Out' by Maz Evans. This will link closely to our topic on the Ancient Greeks. We will initially be reading Greek Myths to gain familiarity with our subject matter and will produce an information text about the signs of the Zodiac. Our main focus will be an extended write where we will create our own quest myths set in Ancient Greece. We will also be writing a diary entry from the point of view of a character from our novel and comparing and contrasting characters within it.

Reading

It is our expectation at Ramsgate Arts primary School that children read for at least 15 minutes every night. Please sign your child's reading record when you read with them. Please also ensure that your child has their reading record at school every day so that they are able to read with a teacher or TA.

Maths

We teach Maths daily and all sessions begin with an arithmetic starter and follow by a main session of learning. This term we will be focussing on the follow areas: Fractions (including improper fractions and mixed numbers), Geometry (examining the properties of both 2D and 3D shapes), Measure (length, mass, capacity and volume).

Both mental maths skills and multiplication and division are heavily reliant on a good working knowledge of times tables, please rehearse them as much as possible at home.

RAPS Curriculum

This term, our topic will be 'Ancient Greece'. Within this unit of learning, we will find out about modern Greece, then journey back through time to examine life for the Ancient Greeks, their military, inventions, what it would be like living in both Sparta and Athens and the legacy they have left in the world today.

PE

Year 5 will have continue to have PE every Monday afternoon and swimming on Thursday afternoon. Please ensure that they have full kit in school.

General

Sipping water throughout the day aids concentration and learning. Please provide your child with a water bottle which they may keep with them throughout the day.

It is vital that pupils arrive at school on time and that absence is kept to a minimum.

Frequent lateness and absences can have a huge negative impact on a child's learning so please try to have your child in school by 8.30 am every day.

Uniform

Our school uniform exists both for health and safety reasons and to develop a sense of pride and responsibility in being a member of the RAPS community. The uniform policy includes the expectation that all children will wear black school shoes (trainers are not acceptable footwear), that long hair should be tied back at all times and that with the exception of a watch and a pair of small stud earrings NO jewellery may be worn by children. We also ask you to remember that children should not be wearing make-up or nail varnish to school and hair styles should not be extreme - this includes unnatural hair colours. The school's uniform policy is listed online. Please ensure your child is dressed according to this policy and that all items of clothing are clearly named.
