Handprint Fly

Supplies

- Sticky back plastic (we used 30cm x 30cm)
- String
- Black pipe cleaners
- Black card
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Sticking tape



- Googly eyes
- White Pencil





Draw a simple fly shaped body onto black card



Carefully peel off the backing paper on one set of the handprints. Then loop and swirl some lengths of string onto each one.



Cut out the fly body shape.



Carefully peel the backing paper off the other set of handprints, then stick these on top of the handprints with the string on. Make sure that you press down and seal the string inside.



Fold the sticky back plastic in half, then draw around a set of hand prints close to the fold. This will mean that when they are cut out you will have 4 handprints.



Now stick the wings onto the fly's body using PVA glue. Place them pointing downwards, with the heels of the hands just below the head of the fly.



Use scissors to cut out the four hand prints, making sure that the backing paper is left on.



Take three pipe cleaners and bend them down at either end to make the fly's legs and feet. Then stick them onto the back of the fly using sticking tape.



Cut several lengths of string, around 20cm long.



10 Finally, stick two googly eyes onto the fly and draw on a smile along with a smile.

Supplies






Step 1. Draw a simple fly shaped body onto black card



Step 2. Cut out the fly body shape.



Step 3. Fold the sticky back plastic in half, then draw around a set of hand prints close to the fold. This will mean that when they are cut out you will have 4 handprints.



Step 4. Use scissors to cut out the four hand prints, making sure that the backing paper is left on.



Step 5. Cut several lengths of string, around 20cm long.



Step 6. Carefully peel off the backing paper on one set of the handprints. Then loop and swirl some lengths of string onto each one.
