Birth / Death

They use their lungs to breathe out and in.

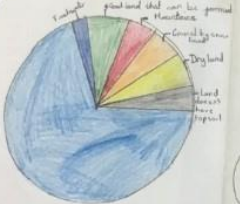
Amphibians live on land or water,

- Core (2,200km radius)
- Mantle (6,370km radius)
- Crust (6.4 to 35km thick)
- Hydrosphere (2,000km radius)
- Atmosphere (2,000km thick)

The world is made up of 5 different regions. They are called continents. There are 5 continents. They are Asia, Africa, Europe, North America and South America.
