## Christian Baptism

There are lots of different traditions and customs surrounding baptism. Some churches baptise babies when they are very young to welcome them into the church family. Other churches wait until a person is old enough to make the decision to be baptised for themselves.

### Christenings

The baptism of babies is often called a **christening** ceremony. At a christening, babies traditionally wear a christening gown. This is usually white to symbolise purity.

A **font** is filled with water which is blessed by a priest or minister. The baby is then held over the font while the priest sprinkles water on the baby's head. Sometimes, the priest will make the sign of the cross on the head.

Sometimes, a **candle** is lit and given to the parents. The candle symbolises the light of Jesus.

As well as the parents, the christening ceremony usually involves **godparents**. These are adults who are chosen by the parents to help make sure that the child is brought up to understand God and remain a Christian.

### Adult Baptism

Some churches do not baptise people until they are old enough to make the decision to become a Christian for themselves. Once someone has decided to become baptised, they have a total **immersion** baptism which means they are completely submerged in water.

Some churches have a baptismal **pool** within the church. Others have a temporary pool which they can put up and take down when needed.

The person being baptised is asked questions by a church leader to see if they are ready to become a true follower of Jesus. Once they have declared that they are ready to be a Christian, they are immersed in the water. When they arise out of the water, it is symbolising arising to a **new life** in Christ.

Baptisms are always a cause for celebration as they represent leaving sin behind and starting a new life with God. The person being christened or baptised is usually given a **certificate** to commemorate the occasion. Traditionally, gifts of **silver** are also given. Christians will usually celebrate a baptism with a **party** after the ceremony.

**Two different Christians were interviewed about their beliefs on baptism.  
Here are their responses.  
How are they different? How are they the same?**

***What denomination of Christianity do you belong to?***

I am an Anglican. This means my church is part of the Church of England.

***What do Anglicans believe about baptism?***

People can be baptised at any age but we tend to baptise babies to welcome them into the church. We call this a christening. We christen babies to welcome them into the church family and so that the parents can declare publicly that they will bring up their child to believe in God.

***What usually happens at a christening service?***

A christening usually takes place during the normal Sunday morning service. During the service, the vicar will ask the parents, godparents and child to gather around the font. He asks the parents, godparents and congregation if they will promise to support the child as he or she grows. He then christens the baby by sprinkling water on his or her head three times. He says, "I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." After that, everyone prays and sings a song to celebrate the baptism.

***Who are godparents and what do they do?***

Before the service, the parents will choose someone to be the godmother and godfather of the baby. Godparents are responsible for making sure the child is brought up in the Christian faith.

***What does the baby being christened wear?***

Traditionally, the baby will wear a white christening gown. White represents purity. Today, not everyone wears white and parents can choose whatever outfit they like for the baby.

***Why do you baptise babies and not adults?***

We do baptise adults too but Anglicans like to welcome children into the church family.

***What else happens at a christening?***

Sometimes the parents will be given a candle during the ceremony. The candle represents the light of Jesus. They are also given a certificate to mark the occasion. After the service, the family will usually have a party to celebrate the start of the child's journey with God.

***What denomination of Christianity do you belong to?***

I am a Baptist.

***What do Baptists believe about baptism?***

Baptists believe that a person shouldn't be baptised until they are old enough to make the decision to follow Jesus for themselves. Baptists will never baptise a baby but children from around the age of ten can be baptised if they feel ready to commit their lives to God.

***Can anyone be baptised?***

Yes, anyone who is old enough to understand what they are committing to can be baptised. Before baptism, the person will usually take a series of classes to prepare them for their new life as a Christian.

***What usually happens at a baptism service?***

A baptism usually takes place during the normal Sunday morning service. Some churches have baptism pools that are built in but some will have temporary pools that they put up and fill with water. During the ceremony, the person being baptised will usually give their testimony. This means they explain how they came to believe in God and why they are now dedicating their lives to Him. After that, they will get into the pool with one or two church leaders. The leaders will ask the person to declare that they believe in God and once they have made their declaration, the leaders will immerse the person completely and pull them up again. Being immersed in the water represents the death of your old life and being cleansed from sin. When the person comes up out of the water, it represents being born again into a new life with Christ.

***What does the person being baptised wear?***

They can wear anything they feel comfortable in. They always bring a change of clothes so they can get into something dry after being immersed!

***What else happens during a baptism service?***

As well as the actual ceremony itself, there are prayers, songs and readings. The congregation makes a promise to support the person being baptised in their faith. The person is usually given a certificate to mark the occasion. They will usually have a party afterwards with family and friends to celebrate their baptism.

## John the Baptist

During the rule of King Herod of Judea, there lived a priest called Zechariah and his wife Elizabeth. They had both wished for a child but had never had any children of their own.
