Dear Parent and Carers,

As you have probably guessed, McAvoys, the building contractors, despite their constant reassurances, are not in a position to hand over the rest of the building today as originally promised. The hall and dance studio are nearly finished but the kitchen still has a way to go. The delays are mainly due to the kitchen contractors letting McAvoys down. As you can imagine, we are all very disappointed but we have been promised a new handover date of the 8<sup>th</sup> March. The delay to the kitchen will mean we will have to postpone Breakfast Week, which was originally earmarked for week beginning 5<sup>th</sup> March.

Thankfully, the delayed contractor's departure has not affected the school's plans to develop the outside areas. The first area still to be landscaped is the Reception outside area.
