


Non-religious communities are not associated with any particular religion.

If a sports club has matches on a Saturday, it could be difficult for Jewish members to attend, as they are supposed to rest on Shabbat.

People who wear special clothes for religious reasons might not be able to take part in certain activities, or they might feel different to others.









Some older Muslim children might find it hard to concentrate in secondary school during Ramadan if they are fasting.







In the United Kingdom, some schools are associated with religious communities.

They are called faith schools.



There are all kinds of faith schools - Church of England, Catholic, Islamic, Jewish, Buddhist and Sikh.

In France, public schools are **secular**, which means they are non-religious.



In French schools, it is against the law for children to wear religious items such as crosses or headscarves.




Not everyone agrees with this. Some Muslim families disagree, as some Muslim girls choose to wear headscarves because of their religious beliefs.

Worldly - not interested in religion


Infidel - unfaithful
