Dear Parents/Carers

RAPS has begun this academic year with a flying start. The first week for us is very much about setting-up routines and then year groups spend the week focusing on personal development. Our English, Maths and Topic curriculums are now in full swing and there is already some fantastic evidence of children's learning, both in their books and up on the walls in the classrooms. Hopefully you all managed to attend the parent information meetings over the past few weeks, but if you didn't, the class teacher would have posted the presentation on the class blog page, along with the learning for the Term. We have parents' meetings week beginning 17th October, so look out for the links for booking face-to-face meetings on MCAS soon.

Pupil voice and joint participation of the running RAPS is key to a happy and successful school. In the past few years, they have raised money for numerous different projects for the school: the Reception garden; the playground planters and activity trail, as well as our small farm and growing area on the field. I know they will be keen to get going again, with coffee mornings and fund-raising activities, so be sure to keep an eye on our FaceBook pages and MCAS notifications for any future Parent Council meetings and activities as they are always keen to recruit more members. This year the school is keen to get a Yurt on the field to provide both an additional space for drama, outdoor learning and quite space for lunchtimes. Reflecting our busy start to the year, our Year 5 and 6 children went on a Ramsgate litter-pick with the Mayor of Ramsgate and our KS2 children have had an opportunity to have workshops with the Assistant director of 'The Ultimate Pickle', which they saw today in the Roundabout mobile theatre, currently at Newington Green this week. Year 1 parents have already been in to school for their 'Art to Start' and Mr Brown and Mrs Smith have revived our Termly Art competition (details found below) which I really can't wait to see around our school.



An important message

One thing that I love about RAPS is that as a school, we are very open to our parent community, literally, as at the beginning and end of the school day our parents have been more than welcome in the school building. As RAPS has grown in numbers, the footfall at the beginning and end of the day has certainly increased, and it is becoming more and more difficult to monitor who is in the building and if everyone has left.

With this in mind, we have had to review our morning routines, and for our KS2 community as of the 1st November the children will enter the school building alone and will not be accompanied upstairs by parents. Between 8.15 and 8.30, staff will be allocated at each door so that messages can be passed onto the class teachers if needed.
