Little Children Explore Big Questions at RAPS

What makes a good human? That is the wide-ranging and multi-faceted question that has been challenging young minds at Ramsgate Arts Primary School.

Last week Years 1 and 2 explored their thoughts through an interactive show called 'Bonhomme' performed by the 'What's Coming out Of the Box' team. They created a magical community garden and encouraged pupils to invent a town and a village – decided by boys and girls as Rosegate and Parmesan Hamster Village.

Discussing the concept of 'a rumour', the resulting story themes, woven around the 'Golem Myth', included being kind and loving, caring for others, having a big heart, helping people if they are hurt, and not fighting back at people.





The show blended storytelling, object theatre, live music and philosophy for children, and the team say: "Children are natural philosophers and start to question the world around them very early on. What's Coming out of the Box firmly believes that children's theatre should not shy away from big juicy topics. We enjoy asking big questions to small people."

Head of School Nick Budge said: "At RAPS we encourage our children to think out of the box, to question their world and community. This show is a fantastic vehicle to invite pupils to discover philosophy and to tackle important concepts and ideas. They were immersed from the start and thoroughly embraced the story and the ideas it generated."

Reception and Year 1 will be studying Midsummer Night's Dream, Year 2 and Year 3 Macbeth, Year 4 – The Tempest and Years 5 and 6 – Romeo and Juliet. I cannot wait to see the fabulous work the children produce.

Breakfast served at RAPS for Reception, Year 1 and 2

We all know that having a nutritious breakfast every morning sets you up to have a healthy start to the day. Research published by the Education Endowment Foundation reported that having breakfast showed an increase in pupils' concentration and an improvement in behaviour. The report also states that having breakfast before school can also boost children's reading, writing and maths results by the equivalent of two months' progress over the course of a year.

RAPS already operates a Breakfast Club that many working families already take advantage of but we would like to extend this offer of breakfast to all our children in Reception, Year 1 and 2. From Monday, breakfast will be available to Reception, Year 1 and 2 children in their classrooms from 8.15-8.25. The children will be given two simple choices, Wheat biscuits or Cornflakes served with semi-skimmed milk. Those children who choose to have breakfast will be expected to serve themselves and wash up their own bowl and spoon (these will then be put through the dishwasher afterwards). Breakfast will be cleared away by 8.30, so if you child is a slow eater and they would like breakfast, then please ensure they are in school at 8.15.
