Learning Sequence



Types of Forests: Show children the images of different types of forests – which ones do we find in the UK? Which ones are not found in the UK?





The Amazon Rainforest: Share the facts about the Amazon Rainforest. Watch <u>this video</u> showing scenes and sounds from the Amazon Rainforest.





Sherwood Forest: Share the facts about Sherwood Forest. Watch <u>this video</u> showing you Clumber Park (part of Sherwood Forest) from the air. What similarities and differences can children spot? (You may need to tell children that the water is a man-made lake, not a river)





Comparing Forests: Children identify similarities and differences between Sherwood Forest and the Amazon Rainforest.





Children work in groups using the Comparing Forests Venn Diagram Activity Sheet and Comparing Forests Venn Diagram Fact Cards to compare differences between The Amazon rainforest and Sherwood Forest.



Children complete the table on the Comparing Forests Activity Sheet to compare aspects of each forest, using the Forest Fact File to gain information.
