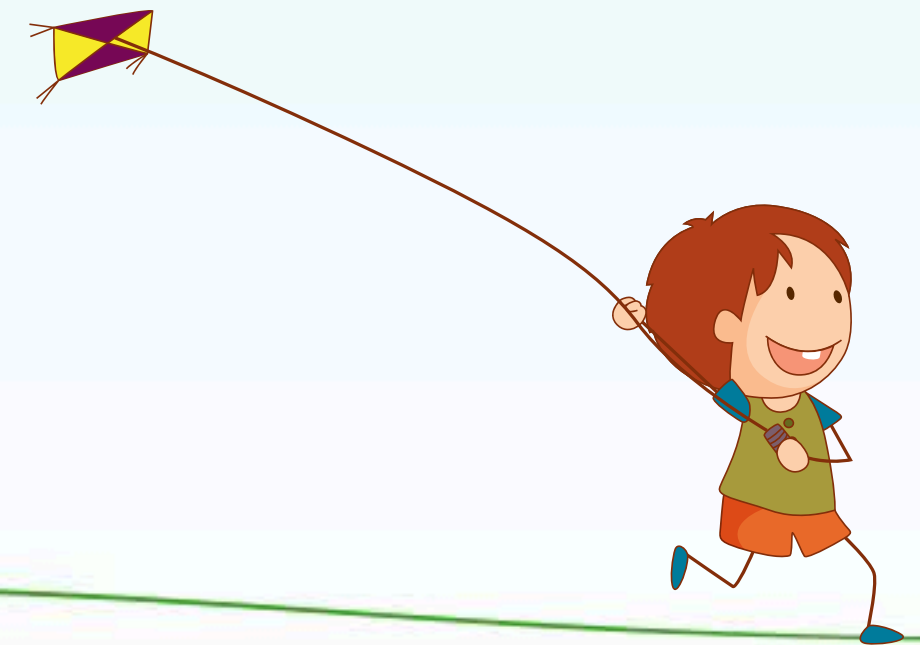
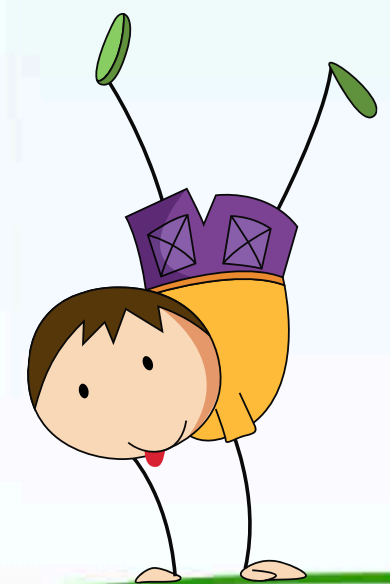


Identity and Belonging

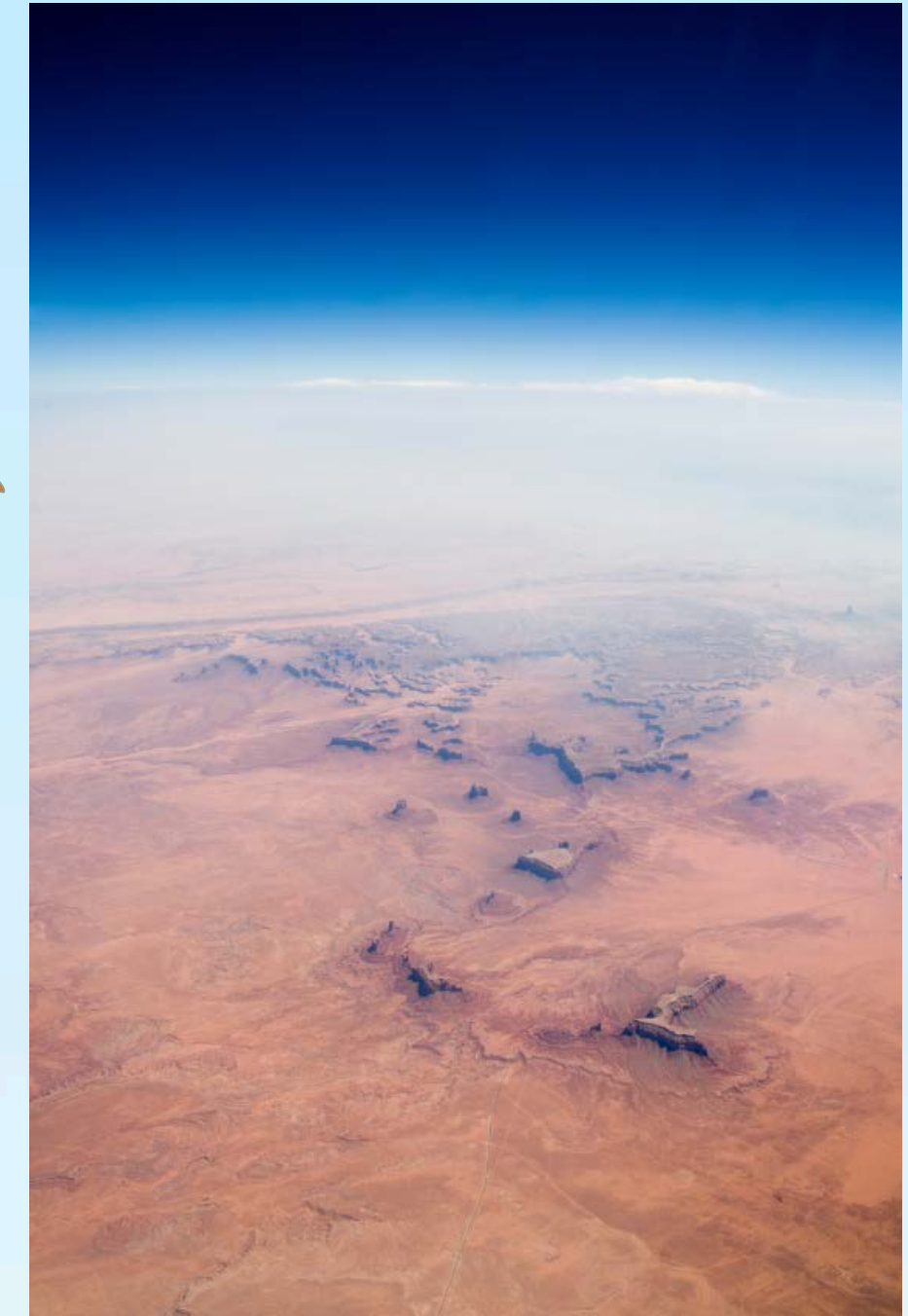

We have a responsibility:

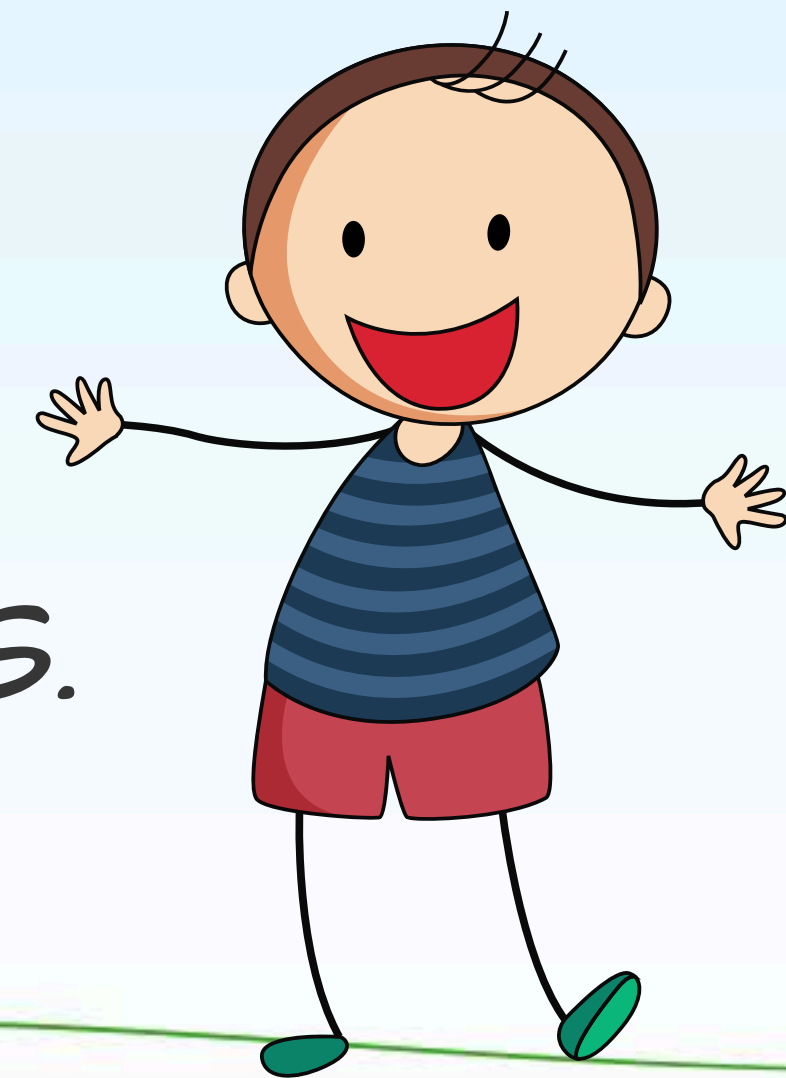
- not to pollute the environment

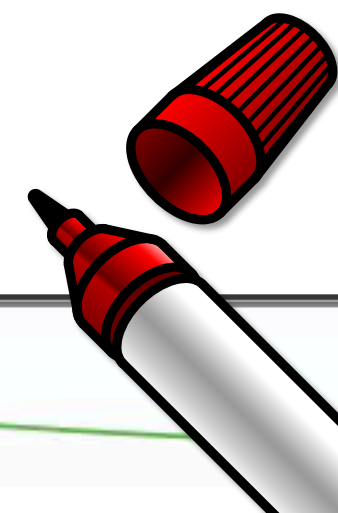

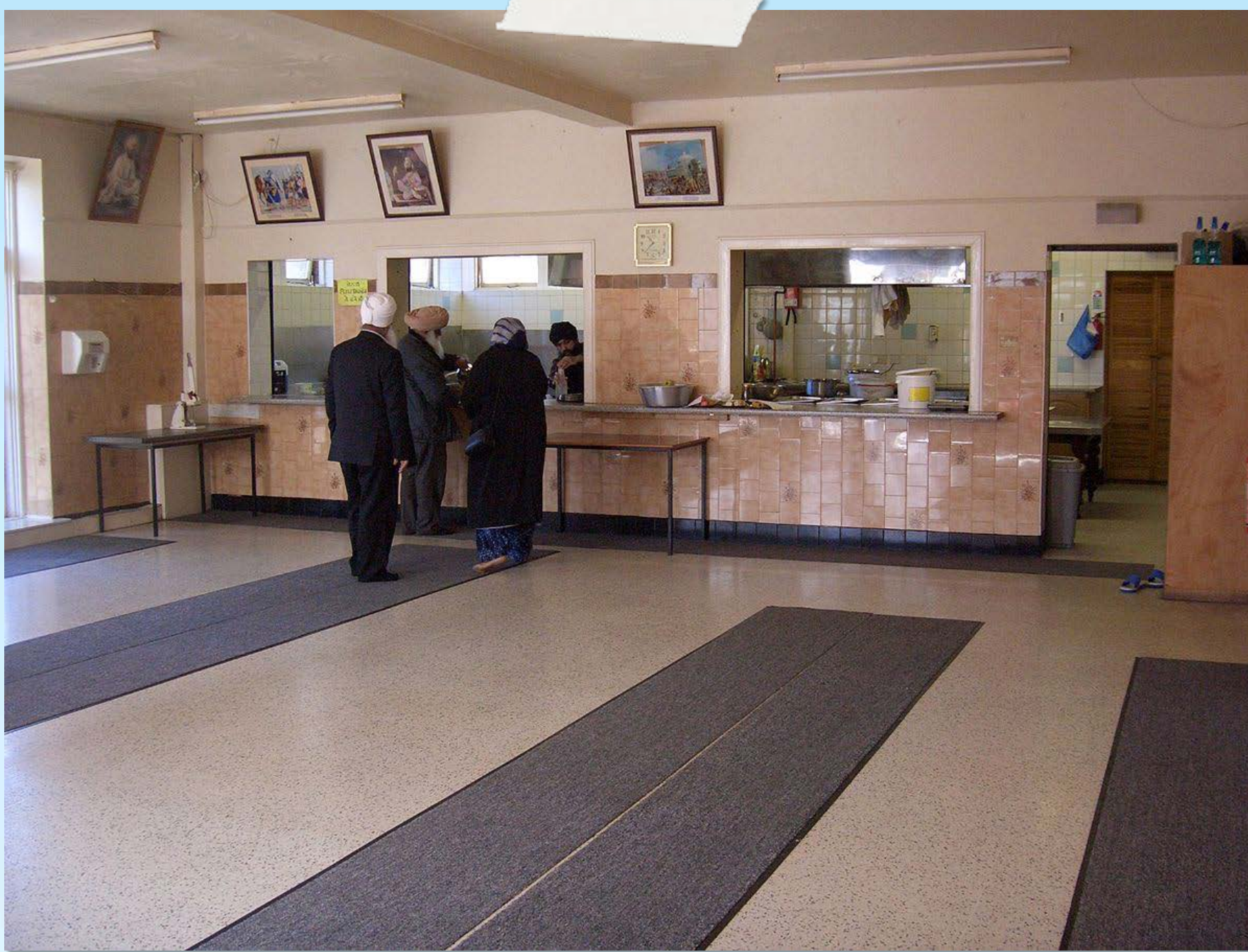
Deuteronomy 24:19-21

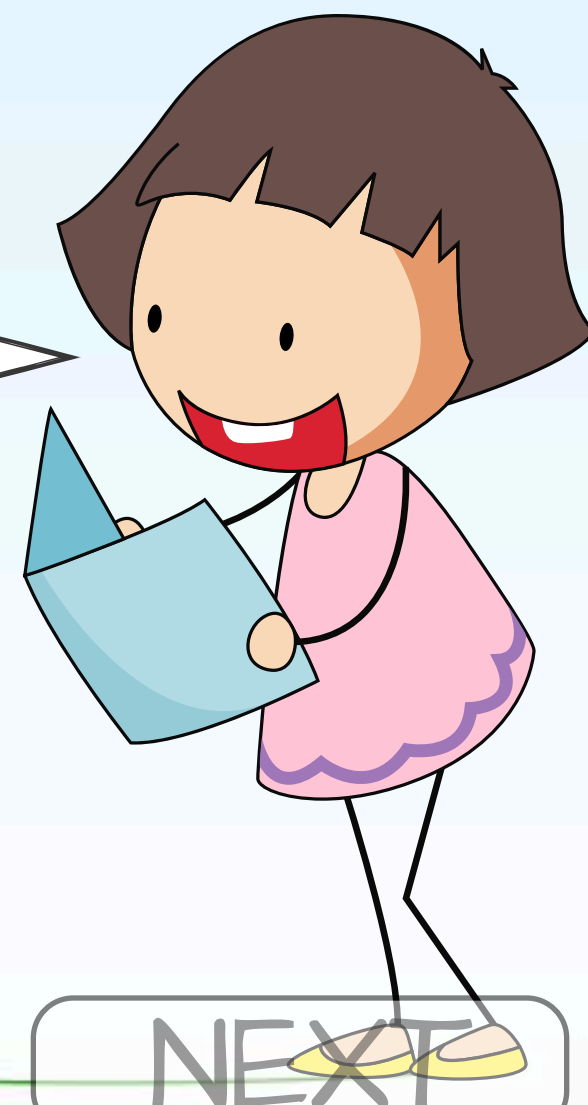
