Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the Summer Term!

It is hard to believe that we now have less than seven weeks of this academic year left. We are all set for a jam-packed final term and are looking forward to many super events including, the Viking Games, transition days, our Summer Festival, Sports Days, Arts curriculum performances and our very first Year 6 Graduation!

This term always brings exciting news about what is to come in the new academic year, but it is also a time when people move on to pastures new. Mr Stevens is doing just this, and I thank him for all his hard work this year. I am sure you will join me wishing him all the very best for the future.

Joining our RAPS team from September, I am extremely pleased to welcome Mr Gunson and Ms Vost, both of whom are experienced teachers. Ms Vost has already worked on lots of arts projects across RAPS, and will be adding more capacity to our Arts team. Mr Gunson, who will be spending a week in school during July, will be teaching Year 5 children. Our staff team seems to be going from strength to strength! Class transitions will work a little differently this year. All children will have an opportunity to meet their new teacher on the morning of Thursday 4th July during our transition morning. They will spend the morning with their new class teachers completing a variety of transition activities that will enable them to get to know the new routines in their new classroom. On this day, the children will be dropped off and picked up from their current classrooms.

Our Year 1 and Year 2 pupils will have additional transition sessions and these will be on the mornings of Thursday 20th and 27th June. For our Year 2 pupils, it will give them an opportunity to meet and work alongside our Arts team. Our two Reception classes will also have additional sessions on those dates. As a school, we want to ensure that we get the balance of each class right, so Team Spurrier and Team Barnes will be mixed up, forming two new Year 1 classes for next year. Details of the new classes will follow next week. The children already know each other extremely well as they currently work collaboratively across both classes during their child-initiated sessions and RWI. They have also been working in their new classes for many activities since last term.

Cultural Diversity Day

Thank you for helping us celebrate the annual UNESCO global celebration for cultural diversity, the children certainly enjoyed the range of activities instead of working in their usual classes. Workshops included African percussion, Spanish songs and stories, creating Chinese willow patterns and Aboriginal art, making rain sticks, finding out about South Africa's Kruger National Park, carnival head dresses and Brazilian dance, and discovering Giacometti's figurines from Switzerland. In the workshop 'What Makes Britain Great', pupils explored the multi-cultural heritage of the UK, filled in their personal RAPS diversity passports with information, and became reporters, carrying out interviews around the school for articles they are writing.





A highlight of the day was the 'Taste the World' special lunch, where pupils, families, staff and guests sampled dishes from around the globe prepared by the Principals catering team. Tasty treats included sausage, mash and onion gravy; vegetable korma and rice; sweet-chilli chicken; vegetable jambalaya; spicy Jamaican patties; vegetable cakes such as pea and vanilla and chocolate and sweet potato; plus scones, cream and jam, cakes and fruit. We were overwhelmed by the generosity and diversity of dishes also brought in by parents and friends.

Among our guests was recently appointed Ramsgate Mayor, Raushan Ara, who was making her first public appearance in her new role, although it was not an official civic engagement. She was invited in by one of our pupils, Alisha, who is a friend of the Mayor. I know that she had a lovely time and was impressed by the sense of community that Ramsgate Primary School has developed so quickly.





The day was a definite success and it is vital that the children learn the importance of cultural diversity and harmony, especially at these current difficult times. One of our school values is 'diversity', and what better way to celebrate this than through exploring it through our arts curriculum, through music, dance, drama, art and food from different cultures!
