Dear Parents and Carers,

First of all, thank you to all of our parents and carers for continuing to respond to our requests for awareness of both social distancing and wearing face coverings whilst on the school site at drop off and pick up. In a time when we must continue to be proactive in our measures and resist complacency, it is very much appreciated. Thank you for considering others and helping us in keeping everyone safe!

Understandably, many parents are still unsure whether or not to send their children to school if they are unwell and they subsequently phone the office, often for reassurance to check they are doing the right thing. I would therefore like to provide clarity on isolation rules:

- If a family member displays Covid symptoms, the whole household should isolate until a negative test result is obtained.
- Should there be a positive case at another school with children sent home from that school to isolate, siblings that we may have at RAPS are not required to isolate **unless** they or a family member display symptoms.

Something else to consider within all of this is the weather and the fact that we must make sure that the school is well-ventilated at all times. This means that windows stay open, regardless of the weather. Please could I therefore ask you to ensure that your children are warmly dressed as the temperature starts to drop. Please also make sure that your children's clothes are clearly named. Teachers do their best to keep track of cardigans and jumpers and return them to their rightful owners but this task is much easier if items are named!

And finally at the Viking Academy Trust we are very fortunate to have supportive and friendly parent bodies in each of our Viking schools. Our parents recognise that educating children is a process that involves partnership between parents, class teachers and the school community. As a partnership, our parents will understand the importance of a good working relationship to equip children with the necessary skills for adulthood. Attached with this newsletter is our 'Parent and Carer Code of Conduct' to provide a reminder to all parents, carers and visitors to our schools about the expected conduct. This is so we can continue to flourish, progress and achieve in an atmosphere of mutual understanding.
