As part of our link with Turner Contemporary at Margate, RAPS pupils have been experiencing Arp's creativity first hand in a series of workshops focussed around the current exhibition 'The Poetry of Forms' that runs until January 14. The children have created colourful and creative items for their own exhibition based around their exploratory artwork inspired by Jean Arp, whose output embraced Dada, Surrealism and Abstraction, and created an impact on the British avantgarde movement. Pupils explored Arp's displays on show at the gallery and then worked on creative follow-up projects that celebrate his drawings, collages, paintings, wood reliefs and sculptures. RAPS After School Club.

At Ramsgate Arts Primary school we hold an After School Club, RAPS Club, which is set up to provide care for children for out of school hours. We provide the children with a light snack at either 3pm or 4:15pm and at 5pm we ensure the children have a more substantial snack/dinner which we eat together (see attached menu). We are able to provide care on an 'as and when' basis if you do not need the club regularly, however, if your child is to attend on a regular basis, payment in advance is greatly appreciated. (Prices per session are listed below.)

During each Club session, the children get to experience a variety of activities both inside and outside. All children are able to choose if they would like to expel a little energy or relax - activities therefore range from football and outdoor games, to calmer pursuits such as colouring, playing board games, watching films as well as playing on the iPads. RAPS Club is open term-time only until 5:45pm and is run by Miss Tranham and Miss Aitken, who are both currently working in Reception. If you would like your child to attend any session, contact the school office or Miss Tranham.

Session 1 - 3.00 to 4.30 - £4.00 per session Session 2 - 4.15 to 5.45 - £5.00 per session Session 3 (a combination of both 1 & 2) - 3.00pm to 5.45pm - £8.00 per session
