Dear Parents and Carers,

On Wednesday our Year 3 children celebrated Universal Children's Day at the Turner Contemporary by taking over the gallery for the day as a part of Pioneering Places East Kent Project. The project is integral to Turner Contemporary's programme - as part of the National Great Place scheme, the gallery is working with our children, inspiring them to take the lead and have a transformative impact in their local community.

Our Young Arts and Heritage Leaders will explore Ramsgate's rich history with artists and heritage researchers. They will lead the project until its conclusion in 2020, collaborating with Turner Prize winning collective, on a Child-Led Plan for Ramsgate, and commissioning a major new artwork to be installed near the Harbour.



The Turner 'take-over' day was a great success. Our pupils worked with artists to help them make their ideas come to life, and the model of their school was placed on a large map of Ramsgate to show its location. They also invented other buildings and made playdough characters. As an arts specialist school, we are delighted to be part of a long-term art project that will encourage our pupils to consider art and heritage in their lives and communities. Working regularly with art specialists at the Turner will focus their learning and also broaden their experiences.

At a time when the 'Kids Rights Index' (which ranks how countries improve children's rights) revealed that the UK's current global ranking is 173 out of 182 countries, and over 4.5million children in the UK are in poverty, this work has never been more important.

Giving children the opportunity to take the lead and be creative is proven to enhance their wellbeing, confidence and listening and speaking skills. Allowing them to show innovation is an integral part of the work we are doing with our community and I can't wait to see what the Young Arts and Heritage Leaders do next.

An exhibition exploring the project's theme of 'place-making and children's leadership' has opened at Turner Contemporary and will run until April 7th. This includes examples of work made by the RAPS children and films documenting their experience on the project so far.



The launch event at the gallery was held on 20th November to mark United Nations Universal Children's Day which was established in 1954 and is celebrated each year to promote international togetherness, awareness among children worldwide, and improving children's welfare.

November 20th is an important date, as this marks the date when the UN General Assembly adopted the Declaration of the Rights of the Child. This is also the date, in 1989, when the UN General assembly adopted the Convention on the Rights of the Child.

Lessons are Magic at RAPS

It's magic! That was the enthusiastic response from our Reception children when Magician, 'Magic Al', saw his young audience rubbing their eyes with disbelief as super magic trick followed super magic trick. As the show developed, he invited pupils from Reception classes on to the stage to help share in his performance. They assisted him with interlocking rings, plate spinning, expanding ribbons, a crazy foam pie act, and being encased inside giant liquid bubbles. Magic Al also climbed inside a giant purple balloon until he was totally vanished from sight before bouncing up and down in front of his startled audience. At the finale of his show he transformed into a 12ft tall stilt walker, creating colourful balloon gifts of swords, puppies, butterflies, love hearts and many more for the children to take away.



For many of our children it was the first time they had seen a magic show up so close. As an arts specialist school we welcome and embrace all kinds of performers to visit. The magic show was a brilliant experience for our pupils and it introduced them to a different type of entertainment in the performing arts.

Rocksteady

Rocksteady is an exciting peripatetic music service, which aims to teach children to learn an instrument by playing in their own rock band, giving the children a chance to rehearse together, perform songs they love and make music fun. Hopefully Rocksteady lessons will be starting in January at Ramsgate Arts.
