Rockin' Out At RAPS

It may not have been the o2 Arena in London or Madison Square Garden in New York, but for Ramsgate Arts Primary's young rockers, it was the show of their lives. Children from as young as four years old were among six bands who played live in their debut gig to friends and parents in the packed school. Pupils from Reception Class to Year 6 have only been learning their instruments – drums, keyboards, and guitars plus vocals – for the last few months with the RockSteady education crew, who have been tutoring them once a week. Each band received huge cheers as they performed their own mini-set to raise the roof as RAPS rocked to the rafters!





The children had only been learning to play for a matter of weeks and yet they were already rocking with attitude, as their debut concert showed. The idea of RockSteady is all about encouraging and enabling pupils to play and perform, the fun element of being in a rock band has been very appealing to our creative youngsters. We were so impressed with the standard they had reached in a short time and that they had the determination and courage to climb on stage and play to several hundred people at a very young age. It has been a terrific experience for them and boosts their self-esteem and confidence. This initiative has also increased the uptake of children taking individual lessons to learn to music theory to play the guitar, keyboard and drums across the school.





The bands taking part in the show were Mashed Potato who performed Happier; The Sapphires – Roar; The Megaflash Penguins – A Million Dreams; The Blue Rockers – Human; and The Black-Eyed Dragons – Rebel Just for Kicks. I can't wait to see what they perform in the summer. All children brought home a leaflet this week if you want to find out more about RockSteady at RAPS.

The Gentle Touch Means So Much

Children are helping to soothe each other with basic massage techniques now at RAPS. The serene sessions have become a favourite with pupils in Reception, Year 1 and now Year 2 who have learned a number of basic 'gentle touch' elements. Under guidance from staff, they apply their hands-on system to one another at varying times of day, notably after break and after lunch. Seated and against a back drop of tranquil ambient music and images, the children take it in turn to give and receive the calming massage. Gently they lightly stroke each other's head, face, neck, back and hands in a slow and methodical way.





The massage sessions are the first step in the children managing their emotional literacy skills and feelings. Children have also engaged with a storybook called Once Upon A Touch that explores the same theme. The book is a fun and creative way to increase general well-being, improve concentration and self-awareness, and encourage relaxation in children.

Pupils are already successfully using another initiative to help deal with their worries - each classroom has a 'Worry Box' where they post their thoughts about things that may be concerning them; there is also a central 'Worry Box' in the main corridor. At RAPS, we feel it is important for children to have the opportunity to normalise worries with a coping strategy, and to understand that it is usual to feel concerned about many different things in their lives.
