# Friday 19<sup>th</sup> July - Sports Day and Picnic

A reminder on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> July, will be Ramsgate Arts Primary School Sports Day. This will be a great opportunity for our pupils to enjoy working in teams and engaging in a range of sporting activities.

### <u>Time: 9:30-12pm</u>

Sports Day starts at 9:30am and finishes at 12pm. We would like to end the Sports Day with a picnic lunch (weather permitting). Children who have school dinners will be provided with a picnic lunch and parents may bring their own picnics. Parents who attend the picnic will be able to take their children home afterwards, if they so wish!

#### Organisation of the day:

The children will be in their house teams. There are eight activities for your child to complete. As groups move around the field and playground to complete the activities, you may follow your child/children (siblings have been allocated to the same groups). Once the group activities are complete, the children will then participate in their own year-group races.

### **Clothing:**

All pupils are required to wear a P.E. kit for sports day. As they will be competing in their house colours, please provide your child the correctly coloured t-shirt (their house colour). If you are unsure, please ask your child's teacher for their house allocation.

As we are hoping for beautiful weather, please provide your child with a sun hat and that all-important sun cream too.

#### Additional information:

- Ensure your child brings a clearly labelled water bottle to school. Please only provide water no other drinks are permitted. Bottles can be re-filled throughout the afternoon.
- As some parents do not wish images of their children to be shared online, therefore please ensure any photographs or videos you take are not shared via social media.
- If you child requires any medication (asthma pumps etc.) these must be in school for sports day.

We are all looking forward to the day of planned activities and really hope you can join us.

This year, there will be two performances of the KS2 Production, Shakespeare Rocks, on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> July at 3.00 and 7.00 in the school hall. This will be a ticketed event and limited to a certain amount per household. A letter will come out later next week with more details.

### Ocean Challenge 2019

This term's Art competition is to produce a sea creature using recyclable material, such as paper, card or materials you have found washed-up on the beach.

To stay eco-friendly and support all environments, we encourage you to primarily use upcycled and recycled paper products for your creations. Here's a list of materials to consider: plain paper, coloured paper, newspaper, magazines, old homework, paper-towel rolls, egg crates, crepe paper, paper plates, coffee filters and paper packing materials.

In addition, like many of the artists we looked at in assembly, you might want to gather washed-up resources from the seashore. If you fancy more of a challenge, you could use more complex art materials, processes, and styles to create your sea creatures—from photography or animation, to ceramics.

- Work can be 2D or 3D, but must be of a sea creature (there are a variety of step by step instruction sheets in the art room to get you started).
- You could use origami, papier-mâché, collage, drawing, painting, sculpture or mosaic.
- Your work can be any size from tiny to ENORMOUS!
- Do not use objects that belong on the beach such as shells, stones or sea creatures (dead or alive!) as they belong in their natural environment.
- Be careful, nets or ropes could hide very sharp objects such as fishing hooks, so get an adult to help you.

Please hand your finished masterpieces in to Mr Brown, in the Art room, by Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> July 2019.
