
Christian Rites of Passage

Why is the first Holy Communion special for Catholics?









During the week before Passover
Jesus sent two of his disciples, John
and Peter, to find a room. This room
would be the place to eat the last
supper before Passover.

John and Peter found a room with a table and couches in it. They left the room and brought back a lamb, vegetables and thin wafer bread for the supper.





Jesus knew that one of his disciples would betray him and tell the chief priest where he was eating the last supper. The priest's soldiers would come and take Jesus away. Jesus knew this would happen during the last supper. He wanted to make sure all his disciples were there.





While Jesus and his disciples were eating, Jesus took the bread and gave thanks. He broke the bread and passed it to the others, saying:

"Take this and eat this. It is my body which is broken for you."

Afterwards, he took the cup of wine and passed it to the others, saying:


"This wine is my blood shed for you. Drink this and remember me."





Jesus knew that Judas was the disciple who had betrayed him. When Judas found out about this, he left the supper to tell the chief priest that Jesus knew.

Jesus then told the rest of his disciples he had to go somewhere, but couldn't tell them where. They all talked for a long time then Jesus left the supper room at midnight.





So, what is Holy Communion?

It is receiving Jesus
Christ in the sacrament
of bread and wine.




Christians eat the bread and drink the wine as it symbolises what Jesus taught his disciples during the Last Supper.




Children aged between seven and eight have their first Holy Communion ceremony.


During the ceremony, children approach the priest and receive communion. The communion is the wafer bread, which they eat. The wafer bread is soaked in wine which represents the body and blood of Christ.




Girls and boys wear white when taking their first communion. This symbolises purity.







Usually, the family holds a party to celebrate this major event.


